

How does our school received Title I & II funds?



First, the federal government provides funding to each state.



Second, Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) ends the funds to school districts. Schools must complete an application and based on the information in the application, the PDE determines how much money each district and charter school receives.



Third, the school identifies students who need educational assistance based on state and local assessments. The school determines how to support students and sets goals. Student progress is monitored through the use of assessments. The school is responsible for tracking all that information for PDE.

Title I Services



What is Title I & II?

Title I of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act provides financial assistance to state and local educational agencies to meet the needs of at-risk children.

The goal of Title I is to provide



instructional services and activities which support students in meeting the state's

challenging performance standards.

Title II, Part A, is a 100% Federally funded supplemental educational program that provides financial assistance to improve the skills of teachers and the quality of instruction in core academic subjects in public and private elementary and secondary schools.

How does the school use the funds provided through Title I & II?

Individual Support

Students that are struggling with reading or math receive additional support. Instructional Support Teachers, work one-on-one with students in reading and math. Mrs. Zuk, our school Curriculum Coach, provides a variety of academic supports to students as well.

Small Group

In addition to individualized support, Instructional Support Teachers and Mrs. Zuk work with groups of 3-5 students on word attack skills, fluency, comprehension, math facts, and word problems, completing work, and learning strategies.

Specialized Classes

Mrs. Zuk supports class instruction for all students to support teaching and learning. Mrs. Zuk meets with students and teachers throughout the week to reinforce reading skills and content area. Though Mrs. Zuk focuses on curriculum, many of her components deal with learning strategies

Classroom Size Reduction

Instructional Support Teachers will work directly in classrooms with students. They will pull individual or small groups of students in the classroom allowing the classroom teacher to focus on a smaller group of students. This helps provide more students with adult support and help.

Materials

The funds can also be used to purchase reading and math materials to support learning, including manipulatives, books and dictionaries!
