#### Terroir Garden Lesson Spotlight: Hands-On Harvest at PHCSE

October is full of discovery at PHCSE! Our youngest learners in K-2 are stepping into the theme "Things End, but Memories Last Forever" by harvesting rosemary and eucalyptus. With their hands (and noses!) they'll explore how herbs can be dried and preserved, just like memories that stay with us even as seasons change. Students will then use their harvest to create sachets, small scented bags filled with herbs, to take home as keepsakes that remind them of the garden.

Meanwhile, 3–6 graders are diving into something creative and entrepreneurial! Using herbs from the Food Forest, students will craft their own scented sachets, but not before exploring the power of branding and naming their product. Along the way, they'll integrate ELA, math, social studies, and the new STEELS standards, while also reflecting on the memories they harvest each day, from learning in the classroom, to friendships, to what they encounter on technology.

From preserving herbs to branding sachets, this month's lessons are all about hands-on learning, fresh air, and meaningful experiences that make education come alive!
